## INSTRUCTIONS FOR USING SK PILLCRUSHER



## STEP 1

Remove a pouch from the dispenser. Place the tablet(s) at the bottom in the plastic pouch. It is recommended that only soft tablets (such as panadol) can be crushed a maximum of 4-5 at a time.

Hard tablets should be crushed individually. Refer to next page for a useful list of non crushable tablets - indicative only.

Note: Do not overfill pouches.



#### STEP 2

To avoid injury to one's self, always hold pouches by the top of the pouch when feeding the pouch and tablets into the crushing area. Lift the handle and place the bottom of the pouch all the way into the crushing area.

Note: The supplied pouches must be used or damage to the pill crusher may result.



#### STEP 3

Without undue force, let the handle down gently to crack the pills.



Tapping the handle rapidly while moving the pouch up and down in between the crushing plates will pulverize the tablet(s) into a fine powder form.



#### STEP 5

After reaching the desired particle size, you can pour the medication into a medicine measure cup for serving to the patient. Tap the sides and corners of the pouch to remove any trapped particles.

## **CLEANING & MAINTENANCE**

The Silent Knight is made entirely of non-rusting materials and may be cleaned regularly with a damp cloth. A facility approved disinfectant wipe may also be used when indicated.

### **WARRANTY**

Guaranteed to be free of material and parts defects. If unit fails due to manufacture defects it will be replaced at no charge. Use of any pouch other than SK Pillcrusher Pouch will void warranty.
